Ferry	HS Bay -Langdale (about 1 hour)
Parking:	Drive about 45 minutes to Porpoise Bay Pedals and paddles for a small fee
Planning	
Nautical Charts	Chart #3512 (Strait of Georgia Central Portion) Load and launch at porpoise bay Paddle to camp site, Nine Miles: (about 4 NM), handrailing about 3 hours. Second option: crossing to Halfway less than 2 NM can take 30-45 minutes. *The wind in the summer can pick up as early as 11 am what makes the crossing very hard.
Suggested trip:	Day or evening paddles from Nine Miles: 1. Salmon Inlet as far as you want to be back before dark or before the wind picks up. 2. Across to Kunechin point: (2.5 NM) continue to Storm Bay (4 NM overall) 3. Across to halfway 4. Day paddle to Tzoonie narrows: Round trip (6 NM) about 5 hours day trip Recommendation: to spend night or 2 at Tzoonie narrows.
BCMT member map https://www.bcmarinetrails.org/map/	Nine Mile Point, Kunechin Point, Tzoonie Narrows Halfway Camp site are well organized, with food catch and outhouses Nine MILE AND Halfway- are large and can hold a dozen of campers. Kunechin is very small (4-6 platforms) and not sheltered from wind. Tzoonie is the most remote and less equipped of all -just outhouse.
